#### **About the score**

Chant Donné is a composition by the French composer and organist Maurice Duruflé (1902–1986). Written as a harmonic exercise based on a given chant for SATB voices, it is part of a collection dedicated to Jean Gallon, Duruflé's esteemed harmony teacher(\*).

Although brief, *Chant Donné* is widely regarded as one of the most emblematic pieces for those seeking an introduction to Duruflé's musical style.

My bandoneon transcription is based on the version available online, which itself is derived from the *Durand* edition. In my adaptation, I preserved the four voices while making slight adjustments to certain passages to ensure the piece is playable on the bandoneon.

In the following pages, you'll find the original "organ" version, followed by the transcription for bandoneon. This allows for a clear comparison, highlighting the parts I have slightly modified.

The arrangement is in the key of **C Minor**, with an **high difficulty** level, making it accessible to skilled bandoneon players.

### Indications and Guidelines

#### **Bellows Movement: Opening and Closing**

In the sheet music, the letter **A** (from the Spanish word *abriendo*) placed on the upper staff next to a note signifies the opening of the bandoneon's bellows.

Similarly, the letter  ${\bf C}$  (from the Spanish word *cerrando*) indicates the closing of the bellows.

#### Specific keyboard layouts

This transcription has been written **specifically** for **bandoneon 142**. However, it may work for bandoneon 144 as well, with some changes for the left keyboard part.
